## Young Karatekas qualified for the 7th Commonwealth Karate Championships

Eight karatekas from RBS are preparing to take part in the forthcoming Commonwealth Games, to be held in Sydney, Australia in July. The karatekas form part of the national squad after their successful participation in the KSA National trials which were held in Soweto in March.

Gee Lenkwe, Obakeng Rapoo, Nastasia Rapoo, Kagiso Rapoo and Kelebogile Rapoo, all from Mogono, Odirile Puswe and Charles Ragwage from Mosenthal and Olebogeng Kgwebane from Tlhabane will represent Bafokeng in the commonwealth games.

The Commonwealth Games is an international, multi-sport event involving athletes from the independent member states. The event was first held in 1930 under

the title of the British Empire Games in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. It was later renamed as the British Empire and Commonwealth Games in 1954, the British Commonwealth Games in 1970, and gained its current title in 1978.

The games include Olympic sports and some sports played mainly in Commonwealth countries, such as lawn bowls, rugby sevens and netball. The games are overseen by the Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF), which also controls the sporting programme and selects the host cities.

Prior to the commonwealth games, Odirile Puswe, Natashia, Kelebogile and Kagiso Rapoo, will travel to Maputo, Mozambique, for the Zone 6 Championships. These ladies are under the instruction of Sempai Gee Lenkwe.
